

Recommendations on the cleaning and disinfection of rooms or areas of those with suspected or with confirmed COVID-19 have visited

Follow these 3 steps:

1 Identify the areas visited or used by the **ill persons**.



2 It is recommended to close off areas visited or used by the **ill persons** and wait as long as practical before beginning cleaning and disinfection to minimize potential for exposure to respiratory droplets. Open outside doors and windows to increase air circulation in the area. If possible, wait up to 24 hours before beginning cleaning and disinfection. **This information indicates if a person become ill inside the building.**

! **Note:** If the ill person is a Driver, then **the truck must be cleaned and disinfected** (box and cabin).

3 Cleaning staff should clean and disinfect all areas (e.g., offices, bathrooms, and common areas) used by the ill persons, focusing especially on frequently touched surfaces (doorknobs, touch panels, etc.).



All the recommendations provided in this procedure are based on the official information from the CDC. These recommendations will be updated if additional information becomes available.
